11/3/20: ELECTION DAY: Vote in person or drop ballots off by 8pm

To limit COVID exposure from in-person voting, all registered voters will be sent an absentee ballot automatically. But you must be registered to receive a ballot.

Ways to Vote: In Person or By Mail Ballot

- In person on November 3rd at your local polling place
- Early in person at your county election office
- Via USPS mail with a postmark on or before November 3
- At a county ballot drop box or county election office by 8pm on election day 11/3/20
- Drop off your ballot at your polling place prior to 8pm on election day 11/3/20
